

1967 Detroit riot

➔ *What happened in Detroit?*

One of the deadliest and costliest riots in the history of the United States was sparked by a police raid on an unlicensed bar on July 23.

The violent conflict lasted four terrifying days and nights.

➔ *Why is this event connected to Newark (1967) and Watts (Los Angeles 1965)*

This tragic event in Detroit **echoed** 2 other similar riots. **Actually 2 race riots** had taken place **previously** in Newark, New Jersey between July 12 and July 17, 1967 and in the Watts neighborhood of Los Angeles from August 11 to 17, 1965.

➔ *What were the direct consequences for the city?*

- 43 people had been killed,
- 473 had been injured,
- 2,509 stores had been looted or burned,
- there were many reports of assaults, beatings and robberies,
- 7,231 people had been arrested.



➔ *What were the long-term consequences for the city?*

After the riots, many small businesses closed permanently or relocated to safer neighborhoods.
